To honor America's veterans for their sacrifices, the nonprofit Honor Flight Network flies them to Washington, D.C., to spend a day visiting and reflecting at their memorials. Top priority is given to World War II survivors and those terminally ill.

According to the organization's Web site, "With

over 1,000 WWII veterans dying each day, our time to express our thanks to these brave men and women is running out." So last Tuesday, Nov. 9, when an Honor Flight carrying veterans from Iowa and Illinois arrived at Dulles Airport, a group of students and teachers from St. Andrew the Apostle Catholic School was there to greet them.

"I felt really good shaking hands with them," said eighth-grader Jonathan Klos. "As they came out, I

## It's Turkey Trot Time

22nd annual event honors Dalton Gulsby, Jim Sanders.

Always on Thanksgiving day, the Virginia Run Turkey Trot is a great way to get some exercise. And this year's 5K race and 2K fun walk — the 22<sup>nd</sup> annual — should be as much fun as ever.

The event also raises funds for Life with Cancer, Inova Health System's nonprofit program for cancer patients and their families. Altogether, Turkey Trot has donated more than \$580,000 to this cause in the past 18 years.

Last year, it raised \$62,000 — its largest amount ever. This time around, said event chairman Dominic DeVincenzo, "If we could raise \$70,000, it would be terrific."

Life with Cancer helps families mentally, psychologically and emotionally. Its programs are for those with cancer and those affected by it, and children and teens learn how to cope and to show their support of loved ones.

Each Turkey Trot is run in memory of a Virginia Run resident who died of cancer during the year, and this one is in honor of two locals — 16-year-old Dalton Gulsby and Jim Sanders, 48.

The 2010 Turkey Trot 5K kicks off Thursday, Nov. 25, at 8 a.m., followed immediately by the 2K fun walk. The running course is USATF-certified; both it and the 2K start and end at the Virginia Run Community Center, 15355 Wetherburn Court, off Route 29 and Pleasant Valley Road, in Centreville.

Register at [www.virginiarun.com/turkeytrot](http://www.virginiarun.com/turkeytrot). Entry fee is \$25, runners; and \$15, walkers, by Nov. 19. Afterward, it's \$27 and \$17. There's no race-day registration for the run, but walkers may still sign up. The fee includes a commemorative T-shirt, post-race snacks and raffle participation.

The event takes place, rain, shine or snow, and parking is available at nearby Centreville Baptist Church, Centreville Pres-

byterian Church, Bull Run Elementary and Korean Central Presbyterian Church (KCPC), all off Route 29. Runners are electronically timed and results posted on [www.pacers.com](http://www.pacers.com).

This year, prizes will be awarded to the three (instead of two, as previously) fastest males and females overall and in the Virginia Run residents' category. The top three runners in various age categories also receive prizes.

Turnout for the Turkey Trot has grown each year, and the 2010 event was the largest ever — 4,200 runners and 600 walkers, for 4,800 people total. "So this year, we had to put a 4,000-person cap on the 5K," said

## Holidays Begin With Clifton Homes Tour

The holiday season begins Saturday, Dec. 4, when the Town of Clifton holds its annual Candlelight Homes Tour. The fun begins with a parade and lasts into the evening.

Sponsored by the Clifton Horse Society, the holiday horse parade is one of the most colorful parades around and is an eagerly anticipated event. Both horses and riders are in costume, and parents and children alike enjoy the spectacle.

The parade starts at 2 p.m. and, afterward, everyone gathers in King's Field, at the end of Chapel Street, for cookies and the awarding of prizes to the participants. Then, from 3-4 p.m., visitors may shop in the town's quaint stores, frequent its restaurants and have photos taken with Santa.

The Candlelight Homes Tour, chaired by Jennifer Chesley, runs from 4-7 p.m. and includes five houses decorated in their holiday finest. They include:

❖ A 1907 Victorian home known as Red Gables and built by the aunt and uncle of actress Helen Hayes. It's been extensively renovated and has been featured in three, national magazines.

❖ A house built around 1890 and lived in for years by the town blacksmith. Back then, a central fireplace and chimney provided both warmth and venting for the cook stove.

❖ The Ford House, constructed in 1880 and later renovated and enlarged. Highlights include everything from a portrait of George Washington that once hung in the Smithsonian to a collection of hand-carved Santas.

# Give Locally

## Local charities report record numbers of Northern Virginia families seek emergency help.

The number of people applying for food stamps and seeking help from food banks has more than doubled in the last few years in Northern Virginia.

This year, 800 families registered for the LINK Thanksgiving food and used coat distribution. That includes 1,774 adults and 2,130 children, an increase from 2009 of almost 400 individuals.

This incredible need is repeated in small and large organizations around Northern Virginia.

Food For Others served 11,900 households and 42,000 individuals in the last year, and despite many donations, the organization is having trouble keeping food on the shelves for the needy. A few weeks ago, Washington Irving Middle School collected 3,000 pounds of food for the organization, Peter Spain, an organizer at Food for Others, told reporter Julia O'Donoghue.

"But most of that food is gone now. ... We had 132 families come in on Friday," he said.

Much of the burden of helping these families has fallen on small organizations with no paid staff, interfaith groups, churches, volunteers. Organizations like SHARE of McLean and LINK depend on volunteers and contributions to try to meet the expanding need for food and warm clothes on a daily basis.

Beyond that, organizations stretch to provide the basics for a holiday meal for Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners and the hope of presents for many children who might otherwise not receive a single holiday gift.

There are many ways to give, with some local charities connecting the donor to a specific family to provide a holiday food basket and fulfill some wishes for gifts. Many organizations encourage the donation of gift cards. Every local group seeking to help the needy right now is facing extra demand and needs both volunteer and financial help.

was tearing up a little because we got to thank them personally and they got to see that people love them. Many of them don't have families, anymore, but they could see that people still look up to them."

In September, parent Anita McCaskey gave St. Andrew Principal Glenda Sigg information about Honor Flight. McCaskey asked if the students could write to the veterans on one of these flights, and Sigg agreed.

The students studied Veterans Day in school, and all 174 of them in grades K-8 wrote the veterans thank-you notes. Then 50 students in grades six-eight, 10 parents and six school staff members welcomed the vets last week as they entered the airport terminal.

"We waved American flags, and students held banners they'd made and cheered on

all 100 veterans as they entered the terminal," said Sigg. "We had the opportunity to shake hands, hug and give our well-wishes to these heroes and express our deep appreciation to the generation that sacrificed so much for the freedom and liberty enjoyed by our country today."

First-grader Sam Shervanick wrote, "Thank you for your service to our country," in his thank-you note. And he drew a picture of an Honor Flight landing here. Second-grader Patrick McCaskey decorated his note with fireworks and a flag and wrote, "I hope you are well and healthy." He said it's important to "honor the heroes who fought in the world wars to save our country."

Natalia Lopez, in fifth grade, noted that the veterans "didn't just do it for one year, but for several." She thanked them for their

DeVincenzo. The walk has unlimited entries.

"The course isn't long enough for so many runners, and people were parking on Route 29 and walking across the street," he said. "Now, police and Boy Scouts will direct participants to walk along a path to the starting line."

Since KCPC's Centreville church is now operational, it's donating its parking lot for Turkey Trot and also contributed \$1,000 to help fund the race. "Some of their members will help out on race day, too," said DeVincenzo. "They've been very generous with us. We also appreciate everything Centreville Presbyterian Church has done

for us. They've donated money, water and volunteers, as well as their parking lot, for several years now."

DeVincenzo's daughter, Tara, a 2006 Westfield High grad, and her fiancé — who were both design students at Fordham University in New York — designed the commemorative T-shirt. It's a big, fat turkey wearing a sweatband and a running suit with the number 10 (for 2010) on it and sitting at the finish line.

The main sponsor is Mitchell Eye Institute. Other significant sponsors are Edelman Financial Services, KCPC, Wilmot-Sanz, Architectural Planning, NASDAQ OMX, VA Runner, Virginia Cancer Specialists, Elantech System and American Windows and Siding of Va. Inc.

Involved with Turkey Trot for 18 years, DeVincenzo likes participating in a community event and knowing the proceeds support a good cause. "A number of people who've had cancer in our community have used Life with Cancer's services," he said. "Cancer takes a tremendous toll on families when one member is affected, and this

organization helps them with a whole range of programs."

DeVincenzo is among a dozen people in the race committee's core group who work from May on to make sure each Turkey Trot goes off without a hitch. "Many of us have been together, eight to 10 years, now," he said. "I've worked an awful lot of hours, but I've gotten much more than I've given."

"There's a great deal of satisfaction raising money for a worthwhile cause that a lot of people have had the opportunity to use," he continued. "The race also creates good will; the community comes together and a lot of people come out and help and participate." Besides that, he said, "Many people on the committee are survivors, themselves, so it takes on added meaning to them."

## Honoring Teen Dalton Gulsby

In 2004, when Dalton Gulsby was 9 years old, he and his parents and big brother Zach ran as a family in the Virginia Run Turkey Trot on Thanksgiving Day.

"We still have our numbers framed," said his mother, Bari Gulsby of Centreville.

But in 2005, doctors found a tumor in Dalton's right leg and he was diagnosed with Ewing's Sarcoma. Eleven months of treatment followed, and he was in remission for a year. But, said Gulsby, "It reappeared in early 2007, and it was a tough battle from then on."

Dalton lost the fight, Aug. 10, at age 16 — right before he was to begin his junior year at Westfield High. Now, this year's Turkey Trot is being run in his memory.

"It's a great event, and we're honored to have Dalton associated with it," said Gulsby. "It raises a lot of funds and awareness."

In better times, he enjoyed playing lacrosse and basketball, as well as video games on his PlayStation 3. Said Gulsby: "He and his friends would be downstairs in the basement playing games for hours."

He also cared about other sick children and, knowing firsthand how scary and lonely it could be for them while in a hospital receiving treatment for cancer, he did what he could to bring them some happiness. For his Bar Mitzvah project in 2007, he collected funds for the Starlight Starbright Children's Foundation.

It's a nonprofit that provides gifts, tickets to sporting events and other fun items to those struggling with serious illnesses. Dalton wanted to give back something to Georgetown University Hospital, where he was treated, so he raised enough money to purchase three, self-contained, entertainment units.

Each mobile unit, or Fun Center, cost \$4,250 and consisted of a flat-screen TV, DVD player and a Wii game system. "All three are now on the oncology ward," said Gulsby. "Since no one had ever given the hospital three at once before, there's a plaque on them with Dalton's name on it."

He also went to school on a regular basis, all through his treatment, and Gulsby said Westfield's administrators were "so supportive in anything that would help him." Eventually, though, she said, "We'd utilized all the treatments available for Ewing's at

Georgetown. He'd had chemotherapy, radiation and operations to remove tumors." And after he died, she said, "The support of Westfield High School and the community helped a lot."

Now there's a big hole in the family's lives, but they're all carrying on as best they can. Zach, 21, is in his third year at Virginia Tech, majoring in International Studies and minor-ing in German.

"The emotions just come in waves," said Gulsby. But she said she and her husband Bill — former commander of the Sully District Police Station — have "a great group of family and friends, and we depend on each other and Zach."

They also take comfort knowing the kind of person Dalton was — "a great boy who impacted a lot of lives," said his mother. "And we're helping collect toys and gift cards for children in the local hospitals through the [Fairfax County] Police Department's Santa's Ride program. So we try to pay it forward." And Dalton is never far from their thoughts.

"Bill and I cry every day," said Gulsby. "But we try to remember that there are amazing doctors out there doing some great research so, hopefully, someday other children won't have to suffer. We had Dalton for five years after he was diagnosed, so we were blessed to have that time with him and we just treasured every day."

Happily married for 25 years, Jim and Kathy Sanders lived in Virginia Run with their two children since 1992. But Hodgkins changed their plans for a long future together and, on June 30, Jim Sanders died at age 48.

"The day before he died was our anniversary," said Kathy Sanders. "He's sorely missed. He was a really funny guy, so observant of people and things, and he'd make witty remarks. He had a great sense of humor and was friendly and always willing to help."

Son Jimmy Jr., 19, a Westfield High grad, is a freshman at High Point University in North Carolina. Daughter Kellie, 17, is a senior at Randolph Macon Academy. But they'll be home for Thanksgiving and will attend the Virginia Run Turkey Trot being run that day in their father's honor.

When Jimmy was younger, his dad coached SYA baseball and soccer for seven years. "He loved working with kids and was very good at coaching," said Kathy Sanders. "He knew how to explain the details of the sport to them."

Jim Sanders also loved golf and was a member of Chantilly National Golf and Country Club and became involved in its junior golf program. He got his son interested in golf, too, and Jimmy was on Westfield's golf team that won states last season.

Because Jim Sanders was always so organized and together, his wife lovingly called him, "Mr. Mom." Said Kathy Sanders: "He always thought about the details a mom typically would. He'd always say he had 6,759 roles for life; he made lots of lists, had a photographic memory and was brilliant with numbers."

Not surprisingly, he was a tax accountant and a vice president at Wolters

Kluwer tax-accounting firm. Although he worked from home, he managed 70 people, and Kathy Sanders said he was ideally suited for his job.

"He was such a positive guy and a proponent of women," she said. "I sell software for HP Cos. and he supported me every time I had an important business meeting. He'd pump me up, tell me my good qualities and make me feel self-confident. He believed in women's abilities to raise children, have careers and feel good about themselves. And after he died, the women he worked with sent me e-mails telling me how much he supported and encouraged them, too."

However, Hodgkins entered Jim Sanders's life in October 2005. After chemotherapy, he was in remission for four years until it reoccurred in October 2009. This time, though, chemo didn't work; so this past April, he had a stem-cell transplant at Inova Fairfax Hospital. His family expected a good outcome but, instead, with his immune system suppressed, an infection set in, his organs eventually failed and he died, two months later, after waging a hard-fought battle.

"An infection is always a risk in a hospital, but we thought he'd beat it because he was strong and young," said his wife. "But he also had diverticulitis that no one knew about and that caused the infection to spread."

Kathy Sanders said the doctors did all they could, but "medicine is a science — it's not perfect — and they really tried to save Jim's life. When he went into ICU after the transplant and got his first infection, they gave him a 2-percent chance to live."

Since then, she said, "It's been hard. It's been four months and I'm still crying." But she said the support of friends, family and neighbors

has helped. "My kids have been supportive — especially my daughter," said Kathy Sanders. "She's a really positive kid; she's got a lot of Jim's qualities."

Her career also keeps her busy. "I'm a strong person because of Jim, but I was always independent, so I know you have to move forward," said Kathy Sanders. "Still, there are days I just miss that laugh and the ability to talk to him about the kids; he was my sounding board."

She said he continues to inspire their daughter. "Kellie was a good student, but she's trying even harder in school now because she saw him fight so hard," Kathy Sanders said. "He lived his words, and now she's living them, too."

Our son is more quiet and laid-back; he's an A-B student and is doing well, too."

As for Turkey Trot, she said, "I think it's a great way for my kids to be involved and feel honored and proud of him. We'll all be there with our extended family. It's actually a great way to celebrate the first Thanksgiving without him, because Christmas is going to be hard."

## Police Warn Motorists To Be Alert for Deer

Fairfax County police are cautioning motorists to stay alert for deer in the roadways. In 2009, Virginia was ranked among the top 10 states in the nation for deer/vehicle collisions. Most occur during the deer-breeding season between now and early January. So motorists should pay close attention and remain alert at all times, especially at dawn and dusk when deer are active and are likely to be seen quickly entering roadways in herds.

Police are posting a mobile sign board on roads where deer/vehicle collisions have been reported in recent weeks, such as Braddock Road and Pleasant Valley Road. Drivers should know that deer are most active between 6-9 p.m. and they should use high-beam headlights as much as possible at night to illuminate the areas from which deer will enter roadways.

Drivers who cannot avoid hitting a deer should slow down and grasp the steering wheel firmly with both hands. They should take their foot off the brake at the time of impact so the front end of their car will lift up and enable the deer to go under the car, rather than over it — reducing the danger of it crashing through the windshield or windows. If the animal is injured or killed, report the collision at 703-691-2131.

dedication and put "a flag and someone at the bottom, saluting" on her card.

Anna Gasser, in fourth grade, said her step-grandfather was in WWII. She, too, said the veterans "made many sacrifices to keep America free." Paul Pilipczuk, a third-grader, said his great-grandfather fought in WWI. On his card, he drew a veteran walking uphill toward a flag.

Seventh-grader Tiffany Harlow said the veterans "are all heroes for what they did. It was really special greeting people who'd fought for our freedom. They were probably surprised because they didn't expect people to be there after they got off their planes. They thanked us for being there and supporting them."

Sixth-grader Patrick Hawkes believes that "People forgot about wars that didn't happen in our generation, so I think the vets feel really happy that people care so much about them. At the airport, they didn't know who we were, but said, 'Thank you for coming,' and either shook our hands or gave us a hug."

Jonathan liked the fact that Honor Flight Network has 72 of those flights a year so "hundreds of thousands of veterans see the memorials to them and to the other vets, throughout the year, not just on Veterans Day." He also noted that St. Andrew held a Veterans Day prayer service in church for the whole school.





## I Could Care Not At All

To finish the emotional arc begun three weeks ago in this space with the column titled, "I Could Care Less," and continuing in last week's column, "I Could Care More," I present a more definitive synopsis of my feelings as a stage IV lung cancer patient/survivor-hopefully-to-be. (Curious. At what point does a cancer patient officially become a "cancer survivor"?)

As difficult as it is now to do something I don't want to do (that "something" being "something" that somebody else wants me to do), it's incredibly more difficult to get me to care about whatever that "something" is that I haven't done. Not that I feel as if I only have a few days/months yet to live (hardly) and as a result, am doing exactly what I want without regard to anybody else's requests/opinions/feelings. But if I don't feel like doing "something," there's an awfully loud "Why should I? I have terminal cancer" voice in my head supporting every self-serving decision I make.

I mean, what is it that someone else can say or do that trumps/takes precedence over my being diagnosed with lung cancer at age 55? I'm already an endangered species; what exactly/how exactly does one penalize me given my health-related-victim-of-circumstances status? As Curly Howard of The Three Stooges said - in a completely different context - while admiring himself in the mirror: "I'm too young to die, too handsome. Well, too young, anyway." So am I, too young. Ergo my general/overall demeanor: empowered. If you don't like it or like my answer, what are you going to do that hasn't already been done: send me to bed without my supper (or a reasonable facsimile thereof)? I'm already in bed, but unfortunately not a bed of my own making since I never smoked cigarettes. And according to my oncologist, only five percent of lung cancer patients are non-smokers. Lucky me.

I'm not invoking "Woe is me" or "Why me?" here. I've never gone there and I never will. However, I will admit to maybe being given a bad hand/undeserved hand, a hand, though, with which I will live - and fight - as long as I can. And as long as I have two good hands, which I still do (the neuropathy has only affected my feet, fortunately), I will continue to write about what I feel and feel whatever I want.

And what I feel - under my less than ideal and anticipated health circumstances is, a sense of entitlement. And by "entitlement," I don't mean everyone bowing at my feet or accommodating/understanding my every move/emotion. Not at all. What I mean exactly is: it's my life/premature death and I'm going to live it how I see fit. I realize there may be consequences to my actions, but given the cancer-diagnosed consequences to my previous non-actions (life-long non-smoker; social non-drinker; minimal recreational drug user, especially over the past 34 years since I graduated college), I feel it's my decision, my right, my privilege; and there's not too much that anybody can do about it.

I apologize in advance for my behavior. I still don't see my attitude changing though. In fact, it may get worse the closer I get to the end of my original 13-months-to-two-year time line. I suppose it could change, if my diagnosis/prognosis changes. If not, I still have hope, and when there's hope, I can cope.
